LeTourneau University is consistently recognized by *U.S. News and World Report* as one of "America's Best Colleges." It has been honored for distinguished community service by being named to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll for exemplary service efforts.

Committed to being a global university, LeTourneau embraces diversity. Students, faculty and staff reflect a variety of ethnicities, races, and geographical backgrounds. All 50 states and 22 different countries are represented in the student body.

Further expansion of global programs is a strategic priority. A new Center for Global Service Learning will build on the international success of LEGS-a unique collaboration of faculty and students that engineers low-cost, sustainable prosthetics for the developing world.

The average SAT scores of entering freshmen are approximately 140-160 points above the national average. In

Fall 2010, nine new National Merit Scholars enrolled at LeTourneau, giving the University a total of 22 National Merit Scholars.

LeTourneau is known for graduating students who exhibit a strong work ethic, character and immediate effectiveness in the marketplace, across the nation and around the world. The University's three-year average graduate placement rate is 91 percent overall.
