

Director of Development

oung Harris College seeks an experienced fundraiser to serve as the Director of Development. The Director reports to the Vice President for Advancement and has significant fundraising responsibilities that complement the College's cultivation of donors and the goals of its capital campaign. The Director of Development focuses on relationship building, gift cultivation and solicitation, and implementation of giving programs and activities that support the College's fundraising goals.



Responsibilities:

- Implementing programs and initiatives to raise unrestricted funds, including conducting the Annual Fund, Local Scholarship Fund, Parents Fund, Phonathon and special events, including golf tournaments
- Identifies, cultivates, solicits and maintains donors for the College, with a focus on increasing annual giving and local scholarships
- Builds and nurtures positive relationships between individuals and community groups and the College

- Articulates effectively the College's mission and goals so they resonate with alumni, friends and potential donors
- Prepares letters, proposals, reports, and other communication materials
- Assists the Alumni Office in promoting support of the College at activities and events
- Develops positive, productive relationships with administrators, faculty and staff across the College community
- Assists senior administrators and others, as designated, on cultivation and/or solicitation calls

- Experience in successful fundraising activities
- Ability to manage multiple responsibilities and projects, including the Annual Fund and the Phonathon, as well as special events, including golf tournaments
- Professional presence to represent the College and Office of Advancement to both internal and external audiences
- Effective and persuasive communication skills, both oral and written
- Ability to identify, engage

- Ability and confidence to develop and nurture relationships with established and prospective donors, including individuals, businesses, churches, and foundations
- Understanding of budgets and records associated with an advancement program

- Working knowledge of social media, especially social networking
- Strong professional interpersonal skills as well as the ability to work as a team member and to take direction



Known for its world-class academic programs, Young Harris attracts students from 65 counties throughout Georgia, 10 other states, and six foreign countries. With a 12:1 student-to-faculty ratio, the College combines a rigorous academic curriculum with a nurturing learning environment. The small class sizes, student-centered teachers, and the traditional small-college environment enhanced by excellent resources and facilities add to the charm of Young Harris.

The Campus

The College facilities and campus are centered on 30 acres, adjoining approximately 700 additional acres of College-owned mountain land. The campus is beautifully landscaped; the facilities are exceptionally well maintained. Most of the 800 students live in campus housing, and there is a strong sense of community throughout the campus.

Academic Programs

The College offers associate and baccalaureate degrees. Additional majors are being added as the enrollment grows. Academic programs include:

- Bachelor of Arts with a major in communication studies, history, English, music, musical theatre or theatre
- Bachelor of Science with a major in biology, business & public policy, or outdoor education
- Associate of Arts with a concentration in the liberal arts or religious studies
- Associate of Fine Arts with a concentration in art, music, musical theatre or theatre
- Associate of Science with a concentration in allied health, athletic training, business, education, outdoor education, recreation or science.



Students Organizations and Athletics

Student involvement in activities outside the classroom is encouraged. Young Harris offers numerous organizations in which students can learn and demonstrate leadership and organizational skills.

The Young Harris Mountain Lions compete in baseball, softball, tennis, soccer, golf, and cross-country. Men's and women's basketball returns this fall as the College's new arena is completed in the Recreation & Fitness Center. The College participates in the National Junior College Athletic Association,

Division I, but is seeking admission to NCAA Division II athletics.

The Community

The College is located, between Hiawassee and Blairsville, near the 7,200-acre Lake Chatuge. Nestled among the scenic Blue Ridge Mountains in Towns County, which is 60 percent National Forest Land, the county has a population of 10,000, growing to 25,000 during the tourist season. The College shares a close and vibrant relationship with the surrounding communities and serves as the cultural center of the region.
