#### THE OPPORTUNITY

Frank White Academy, a college preparatory school for average and above average students in grades 5 through 12; the Registrar, and Research, Grants and Sponsored Programs. The Vice President also oversees the University's 12 extended learning sites, the Carnegie Vincent Library, Institutional Research and Accreditation, and the Abraham Lincoln Library and Museum.

The Vice President will work collaboratively with administrators, faculty and staff to strengthen and expand academic programs and services. The senior administrator will build on the University's historic commitment to

# PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES


- Provide vision, strategic direction and oversight in building strong undergraduate and post-graduate academic programs and services

- Advocate inclusion and diversity in the staff, faculty and student populations



#### THE UNIVERSITY

LMU is a private, comprehensive university that offers bachelor, master, and doctoral degrees. With the main campus in Harrogate, Tenn., the institution provides academic programs at 12 extended learning sites across Tennessee and Kentucky, as well as online and interactive television courses and programs.

Founded in 1897, LMU grew out of the love and respect for the nation's 16th president, Abraham Lincoln, and today honors his name, values and spirit with education and service. Throughout the past 113 years, the University has provided educational opportunities, developed community leadership and expanded the economic and social forces within the Appalachian region.

The co-educational institution is strong and growing with enrollment increasing more than 60 percent over the last decade. More than 4,000 students are pursuing undergraduate or post-graduate degrees in LMU's seven schools: Allied Health Sciences, Arts and Sciences, Business, Education, Law, Nursing, Osteopathic Medicine. The University anticipates further additions to and changes in its academic programs as it considers the role of higher education and the needs of the



Appalachian region that it is dedicated to serving.

Providing a challenging academic program in an engaged-learning environment and close-knit community, LMU faculty members know students as individuals and are committed to preparing them for successful careers. More than 85 percent of the full-time faculty teaching undergraduate programs have doctorates or the highest degree in their field. The average class size is 17 students.

The University utilizes the finest technology in teaching. Most classrooms have Smartboards, data projectors and plasma screens to enhance the educational experience. The campus is equipped with wireless Internet.

The 1,000-acre campus in Harrogate is expanding rapidly to meet the growing demands of new programs and the increased enrollment. Two new residence halls were completed in 2008, with five more halls planned. This summer, LMU broke ground for a new 120,000-plus-square-foot classroom and laboratory building, which will house math, science and nursing classrooms and labs, along with space for student and faculty research. Another recent addition is a driving range and a three-hole executive golf course for its professional golf management program.
