The Graduate Counseling and Psychology Program Director is responsible for the program's curriculum, the student clinical placements (both internally at the university's counseling center and externally at a variety of local agencies), and the CACREP accreditation process. Other responsibilities include conducting the program evaluation, reviewing learning outcomes, and providing faculty supervision.

This leadership position includes a 12-month Program Director appointment and a full-time, nine-month, tenuretrack faculty contract at least at the Associate Professor level, effective August 2011. The Director's teaching

responsibilities are two courses per fall and spring semester, and additional compensation is received for summer teaching.

Position Requirements

To be considered, candidates must have:

- A doctorate in Counseling or Counselor Education or related field, preferably from a CACREP accredited program
- A current and valid Texas LPC or LMFT licensure or have the ability to obtain a Texas license within six months of being hired
- At least five years of higher education experience teaching in a Counseling or Counselor Education program
- At least three years of proven higher education administration experience as a Department Chair, a Program Director or a similar position of responsibility
- Counselor Education and Supervision and CACREP program experience

Counseling and Psychology Programs

The Graduate Programs in Counseling and Psychology prepare students from diverse backgrounds and cultural experiences to be master's level clinicians for the mental health and education fields.
