Georgia Southern University, a comprehensive research institution of the University System of Georgia, seeks an experienced **Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner** to serve in the School of Nursing in the Waters College of Health Professions. An academic, 9-10-month tenure-track appointment, this faculty member will hold the rank of **Assistant Professor of Nursing**. The preferred start date is **August 1, 2019**.

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The Opportunity

Georgia Southern University is the state's largest and most comprehensive center of higher education south of Atlanta. with the mission and objectives of the University. The School is dedicated to graduating nursing professionals who are leaders and capable of meeting the health care challenges of the 21st century.

The School of Nursing has 53 full-time and 66 part-time faculty members with classes taught on both the Statesboro and Armstrong campuses and online. The School of Nursing currently enrolls 163 graduate and 613 undergraduate students. The Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner track has 18 students.

There are four undergraduate nursing degree programs: the **Bachelor of Science in Nursing**, the **Accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing (ABSN)**, the **LPN/LVN-BSN Advanced Placement Track (Bachelor of Science in Nursing for Licensed Practical Nurse)**, and the **RN-BSN (Online Bachelor of Science in Nursing for RNs)**.

At the graduate level, Georgia Southern offers the **Post-BSN to Doctor of Nursing Practice with Master of Science in Nursing** opt out, the

Master of Science in Nursing (Chronic Care Management and Nursing Education), and the **Post-MSN Doctor of Nursing Practice** programs. All of the graduate nursing programs are online, with faculty from both campuses contributing to these programs.

Four **Post-Master of Science in Nursing Certificates** are available: the **Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP)**, the **Psychiatric/Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP)**, the

Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner, and the **Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner**. These graduate programs place Georgia Southern at the top of the list of nursing schools in the state, boasting a **passing rate of 99 percent on certification exams**. The School continues to break the barriers of nursing education, providing the training students need to pursue nursing and teaching careers.



The School of Nursing offers state-of-the-art facilities and labs on both the Statesboro and Armstrong campuses.

The new \$24-million Health Professions Academic Building houses the Waters College of Health Professions on the Armstrong Campus. With the ribbon-cutting held January 2019, the construction project included the new two-story, 63,000-square-foot health professions facility and associated renovations to the 46,000-square-foot Ashmore Hall.

The new facility has a Simulation Suite and provides a variety of hands-on team-oriented learning opportunities for students. Other features of the building include nursing skills and assessment labs, communication sciences and disorders labs, cardiovascular intervention sciences lab, medical laboratory sciences, radiation therapy, nuclear medicine, and sonography.

About the Position

The successful PMHNP candidate will have the opportunity to participate in charting a new course for nursing education at Georgia Southern through course and program development, innovative instruction, and formulating academic partnerships that will provide



students with state-of-the-art learning experiences. Reporting to the Chair of the School of Nursing, this position is located on the Statesboro campus, but may require teaching on other campuses.

While the University is seeking a doctorally prepared PMHNP to teach primarily in the PMHNP track, this faculty member may teach courses outside of the track now or in the future based on scheduling.

Duties and responsibilities include:

- Conducting didactic and clinical

instruction in undergraduate and graduate courses.

- Participating in student advising and success.
- Participating in ongoing program and curricular assessment.
- Demonstrating continuing professional growth and scholarly development.
- Maintaining expertise in areas of responsibility.
- Participating and serving in departmental, college, and university committees and initiatives.

School of Nursing Chair and Professor

Dr. Catherine Gilbert joined the faculty of Armstrong in Savannah in 2003 as Assistant Professor of Nursing and rose through the academic ranks. She was Chair of the School of Nursing at the university when the institution was consolidated with Georgia Southern. She continued in her leadership role of the School of Nursing on both the Statesboro and Armstrong campuses.

She earned her BSN degree in 1989 from Ryerson University and MS degree in 1992 from the University of Toronto, both located in Ontario, Canada. She received her EdD degree from Georgia Southern University in 2006.

Minimum Qualifications

Candidate must have by August 1, 2019, an earned doctorate in nursing, or a closely related field, and an active unencumbered RN licensure in Georgia. Certification and licensure as a Nurse Practitioner in the state of Georgia and at least one year of clinical experience as a PMHNP also are required.

Candidate must be prepared to relocate to Statesboro, GA, or the surrounding area, and be authorized to work in the United States for the duration of

Georgia Southern University

Georgia Southern has a rich history in serving the state's educational needs as two outstanding institutions.

The Statesboro Campus was founded in 1906 as a school for teaching modern agricultural production techniques and homemaking skills to rural school children, with its first classes held in 1908. As the mission and needs of the region changed over the next eight decades, so did the institution. In 1990, it became Georgia Southern University, the state's first regional academic institution south of Atlanta.

Armstrong State University went through a similar transformation. Founded in 1935 by the City of Savannah as a junior college, Armstrong became a two-year unit of the University System of Georgia in 1959 and received four-year status five years later. In 1978, the college gained state university status. In 2016, it opened a second campus in Liberty County, providing special services to military personnel.

In 2018, the Georgia University System consolidated Armstrong State University and Georgia Southern University, creating an institution that retained the Georgia Southern University name and the outstanding academic programs of both.

The University serves diverse student populations at each campus location, including a predominantly traditional student population at Statesboro, a significant non-traditional student population at Armstrong, and a strong military-affiliated student population at Liberty. In addition, Georgia Southern offers a wide range of online programs and a strong Division of Continuing Education.

Since its earliest days, the University's hallmark has been a culture of engagement that bridges theory with practice, extends the learning environment beyond the classroom, and promotes student growth and life success. Central to the University's mission is the faculty's dedication to excellence in teaching and the development of a fertile learning environment exemplified by a free exchange of ideas, high academic expectations, and individual responsibility for academic achievement.

Georgia Southern University’s Statesboro Campus is located in an inviting city with a population of approximately 31,000. Statesboro is known for its hospitality, friendliness, mild year-round climate, and high quality of life.
