

Florida Polytechnic University was created 2012 as Florida's first and only all-STEM public university and welcomed its first class of students in the fall of 2014. The University's goal: provide an excellent STEMfocused education preparing high-ability students to meet the mounting statewide demand for the high-skill professionals industry needs to succeed and continue innovating.

After aggressively achieving critical milestones and accreditations, the University began building its reputation as a remarkable provider of STEM degrees. It rapidly proved its value to the state with the success of its very first graduating class and has been growing since into a solid producer of highly skilled graduates.

Florida Poly is nationally ranked and recognized for its top-quality STEM education, career outcomes, and outstanding affordability. It has more than 1,700 high-achieving students working toward degrees in 12 undergraduate and five graduate programs. Each program is created to be responsive to the evolving needs of industry as technology and scientific advances develop. With an emphasis on hands-on education and small class size, the University provides students with real-world experience through internships, capstone design projects, and employment opportunities with high-tech employers throughout the state.

Florida Poly has deliberately and exponentially grown essential aspects of the institution, including student enrollment, distinguished research faculty, academic programs, industry partnerships, and campus facilities. The iconic campus in Lakeland boasts two awardwinning and architecturally stunning academic buildings, and a third opens in 2025. Its student body has grown significantly, sparking the need to build a third residence hall, which opened in the fall of 2024.

As the Chief Development Officer and CEO of the Foundation, the right candidate will work closely with the University President and Foundation Board to plan and lead fundraising initiatives, establishing very high expectations and aggressive, achievable goals. The role oversees all Foundation activities, including fundraising and managing relationships with current and prospective donors.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Development Operations

• Directs a program of fund development for the University, which achieves goals for external resource development, charitable contributions, planned giving, donor cultivation, alumni and donor records, campaign management, and resource allocation.

University Foundation

• Coordinates all major decisions regarding the Foundation with the President of the University.

Fundraising Goals

- Establishes and is accountable for fundraising and alumni development goals and objectives each year.
- · Administration of an annual fund campaign and special, major, and planned gift programs.
- · Administration of prospect/donor research, gift processing and records, donor cultivation, recognition and stewardship, and the comprehensive and integrated operations and systems needed to support the University.
- Creates a culture of strong collaboration with the University and operates the Foundation in lockstep with the mission, vision, guiding principles, and strategic plan of the University, and the administrative goals of the University President.

Donor Relations

- Identifies and cultivates prospective donors (individuals, corporations, and foundations).
- Provides leadership for communicating the needs of the University to donors and prospective donors. Manages personnel and develops aggressive goals for fundraising for all development officers.

Reporting

 Prepares appropriate statistical reports on all fundraising, development, and alumni activities, and presents those reports regularly (as requested) to the President.


- Nine years of experience with demonstrated successes.

Vice President of Strategic Initiatives, Development, and External Relations

Kelli Stargel is the Vice President of Strategic Initiatives, Development, and External Relations at Florida Polytechnic University, where she leads the efforts to develop and manage statewide relationships and partnerships, leveraging them to further the University's goals. This includes maximizing engagement opportunities for industry partners, donors, business and community leaders, and other major constituent groups throughout the state.

A former Florida State Senator (2012–2022) and Chair of the Senate Appropriations Committee, Stargel played a pivotal role in shaping the state's budget, particularly in education, infrastructure, and economic development. She also served in the Florida House of Representatives (2008–2012), where



she championed policies that expanded access to education, strengthened workforce development, and supported STEM initiatives. During her time in the legislature, Stargel was instrumental in pushing policy that established Florida Poly as the State of Florida's only all-STEM University as well as securing necessary state funding.



LAKELAND

Nestled in the heart of Central Florida, Lakeland blends small-town charm with big-city conveniences. With about 120,000 residents, it offers an ideal mix of peaceful suburban life and the excitement of a lively city. Known for its stunning landscapes, Lakeland is home to several beautiful lakes, including Lake Hollingsworth, Lake Mirror, and Lake Morton. These tranquil spots provide opportunities for boating, fishing, picnicking, and outdoor exercise, with the historic Lake Mirror Promenade being a favorite for leisurely strolls and cultural events throughout the year.

Lakeland has something for everyone, including Downtown's charming Munn Park Historic District, with its unique shops and restaurants, and the newly opened Bonnet Springs Park, an urban and natural park perfect for families and outdoor lovers. Circle B Bar Reserve offers restored wetlands and wildlife trails, and the Downtown Farmers Curb Market is a terrific spot to explore local produce, crafts, and more. Lakeland's rich cultural scene features live performances at the Lakeland Community Theatre and the Polk Theatre, and the Imperial Symphony Orchestra brings beautiful music to the city.

For education, Polk County boasts a strong school system with 120 public schools including magnet

and charter schools, nearly 30 nationally accredited workforce academies, six Florida Arts Model Schools, and 25 private schools.

With warm, sunny weather year-round, Lakeland offers endless opportunities for outdoor activities and sports. The city is home to the Detroit Tigers' spring training and hosts various other sporting events. Just a short drive away, residents can catch professional sports teams like the Tampa Bay Rays (MLB), Lightning (NHL), and Buccaneers (NFL), as well as the Orlando Magic (NBA) and Orlando City Soccer Club (MLS).

Locally, you can enjoy hiking and birding at Circle B Bar Reserve, kayaking with exotic animals at Safari Wilderness Ranch, exploring trails, gardens, and museums at Bonnet Springs Park, or fishing for bass at Tenoroc Fish Management Area, one of the top lakes in the state.

Above all, Lakeland's greatest treasure is its people. Both longtime residents and newcomers in this friendly community give the city a warm and lively vibe. From historic neighborhoods to modern developments, Lakeland's diverse mix of living options reflects the city's growth and charm.
