# Dean of the School of Nursing



Mississippi College (MC), a private Christian University based in Clinton, Mississippi, invites applications for an outstanding nurse educator to provide strategic, visionary leadership as a **Professor of Nursing** and the Dean of the School of Nursing. Reporting to the Provost and Executive Vice President, the Dean serves as the academic and administrative leader for the School of Nursing and works collaboratively with administration, faculty, staff, students, and the healthcare community to advance nursing education. This position will be located on the main campus with a preferred start date of Spring or Fall of 2025.



Nestled in the center of Clinton, Mississippi, is the beautiful and historic campus of Mississippi College (MC). Founded in 1826, MC is both the oldest institution of higher learning and the largest private university in the state of Mississippi. It is also the second-oldest Baptist University in the nation.

As a private, co-educational, Christian university affiliated with the Mississippi Baptist Convention, MC values the integration of faith and learning throughout the educational process. The intellectual development of our students is grounded in the liberal arts and sciences with concentrated study across the following seven schools: Business, Christian Studies & the Arts, Education, Humanities & Social Sciences, Law, Math & Science, and Nursing.

With more than 80 areas of study, 15 graduate programs, a doctor of jurisprudence, a doctor

of education leadership degree, and a doctor of professional counseling degree, Mississippi College seeks to be a university recognized for academic excellence and commitment to the cause of Christ. The University is accredited by SACSCOC and planning is now underway for the University's 2026 Bicentennial Celebration, the first 200th anniversary of an institution of higher learning in Mississippi.

MC's total enrollment for Fall 2024 will eclipse 4,000 students, with more than 350 students pursuing degree programs in the School of Nursing. MC was named among the Best Christian Colleges (#16 of 333) in America by Niche.

### SCHOOL OF NURSING

The MC School of Nursing was established in 1969 on the principles of Christian service, encouraging students to become positive contributors to the profession of nursing and to society. The School is governed by the Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL) for the State of Mississippi and Accreditation is held by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). Didactic Nursing classes are conducted on the Mississippi College main campus, but clinical portions of the nursing program utilize a variety of hospitals and agencies in the area around Jackson, Mississippi. Students may also elect to pursue learning experience in other locations within the U.S. or in foreign countries. The Mississippi Board of Nursing reported that the December 2023 graduating class in the MC School of Nursing achieved a 100% pass rate on their National Licensure Examination (NCLEX).

The MC School of Nursing offers programs of study leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree and a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN)

degree. The BSN degree is available in a traditional or accelerated (for second-degree students) format at the campus location in Clinton, Mississippi. The RN-to-BSN and MSN degrees are offered completely online. The next Dean will have the opportunity to finalize the development of an additional MS degree in nursing.

In addition to the nursing degree programs mentioned above, the School of Nursing offers a Bachelor of Science in Public Health (B.S.P.H.), a minor in Public Health, and a Master of Health Services Administration (M.H.S.A.) through the recently established Gertrude C. Ford Center for Public Health. The next Dean of nursing will have the opportunity to lead the Department of Public Health in establishing a Master's of Public Health (M.P.H.) degree program.

The mission of the School of Nursing is to prepare healthcare professionals to care for diverse populations by demonstrating Christian Caring, utilizing informed clinical judgments, and practicing safe client-centered care.

- · Lead faculty in program review, development, and systematic evaluation of the Nursing programs
- Provide leadership and guidance in student education and development through supervision of the curriculum, teaching, and the advising process.
- · Promote, arrange, and maintain effective communications and contractual agreements between the university and the academic community, cooperating community agencies, accreditation agencies, governmental entities, the medical community, and clinical partners.
- Recruit, recommend, supervise, and evaluate faculty and staff.
- Advocate for nursing faculty and students.
- Communicate the needs and progress of the School to University administration.
- Actively participate as a member of university, professional, and community organizations.
- Represent the School of Nursing on Administrative, Academic, and Admissions Councils.
- Serve as an ambassador for the School of Nursing, and represent the School and University in the local and professional communities.
- Promote collegiality and collaboration within the School, the University, and with outside agencies.

- · Model fiscal responsibility by maintaining and overseeing the School budget.
- Engage in and encourage faculty to participate in research and publication activities.
- Provide an atmosphere conducive to faculty and student involvement in the growth of the program.
- · Remain knowledgeable of current standards and best practices in nursing education.
- Prepare reports for accreditation agencies, regional and national educational agencies, and university
- · Explores ideas for expanding and developing academic programs.

### MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Doctoral degree in nursing (PhD or DNP); or a graduate degree in nursing and a doctoral degree from a regionally accredited institution.
- An unencumbered current license to practice in Mississippi or hold a multistate license from another NLC state.
- A minimum of five (5) years of experience in a registered nursing education program including teaching, curriculum development, and program evaluation.
- At least two years of leadership, management, and/or administrative experience in the discipline of nursing.
- A minimum of two years of clinical experience.
- Ability to satisfy a criminal history background check required by the Board of Nursing.

- Professional accomplishments and scholarly productivity that support a faculty appointment with an academic rank at the tenured, full professor level.
- Enthusiasm for the Christian mission and vision of the University and the Christian caring component of the School of Nursing's mission.

### PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

- Commitment to the liberal arts mission of the University, ethics, fairness, and diversity.
- Broad knowledge of program assessment, evaluation, and accreditation processes.
- Demonstrated effectiveness in management of fiscal resources, strategic planning, and program development.
- Experience in building and sustaining external relationships with clinical and community partners
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills.
- Experience with curriculum development and assessment including online course delivery, engaged learning, simulation, and use of instructional technology.
- Experience with Masters, Doctorate Programs or innovative new practice programs that impact the field of nursing and healthcare.
- Experience with innovative ways to generate resources.
- Knowledge of scholarly publications, trends in higher education and nursing, and effective professional development.

## LEGE LEADERSI



### **PRESIDENT**

Dr. Blake Thompson just completed his sixth year as president of Mississippi College during which time the private institution has experienced renewed enrollment growth, announced an academic scholarship program unmatched in the state, introduced innovative programs of study and enhanced the historic campus.

Under Thompson's leadership, Mississippi College started the Speed Scholarship in 2022 to honor longtime benefactor Leland Speed – which provides full tuition for admitted high school or transfer students who are residents of Mississippi. The Speed Scholarship led to a record class of over 1,000 new students in Fall 2023, and applications for 2024 are up 60 percent

from two years ago, which goes against the national trend of decreasing enrollment.

Nationally, Thompson was appointed to serve a seven-year term on the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II Presidents Council, the division's highest governing body. He has also served as President of the Mississippi Association of Independent Colleges and Universities for the past four years and is beginning a one-year term as President of the Mississippi Association of Colleges (MAC) - the annual meeting of all of the state's two- and four-year higher education institutions, which he convenes in July of 2024.



### PROVOST AND EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT

Dr. Michael J. Highfield is beginning his second year as Provost and Executive Vice President, Dean of the Graduate School, and Professor of Finance at Mississippi College. Dr. Highfield joined Mississippi College in 2023 after serving on the faculty at Louisiana Tech University (2002-2005) and Mississippi State University (2005-2023). He holds the Chartered Financial Analyst® (CFA) designation from the CFA Institute, the Certified Treasury Professional® (CTP) designation from the Association for Financial Professionals, and the Chartered Banking Professional® (ChBP) designation from the Graduate School of Banking at Louisiana State University (GSBLSU).



**Clinton, Mississippi**, has a rich history and stands tall as Mississippi's hidden gem. A town of more than 26,000 residents, Clinton has been named one of Mississippi's "Most Livable Cities" and one of the state's safest cities. Home to some of the most outstanding schools in the state and boasting an atmosphere saturated in celebrated history and charm, the city embodies the friendly essence and authentic work ethic of Southern living.

Historic brick-covered streets welcome you to a charming Olde Towne community which connects the city with Mississippi's oldest campus. You can stroll through the hometown of writer Barry Hannah or visit the art studio of renowned artist Wyatt Waters. The city boasts a number of parks, as well as walking and

jogging trails with immediate access to the Natchez Trace for bicycling enthusiasts. With a variety of state-of-the-art sporting facilities, Clinton is also home to Mississippi's only professional soccer team, the Mississippi Brilla.

In early 2024, Mississippi College unveiled a partnership with city and business leaders for a new, mixed-use development adjoining the main campus. With state and federal investments of over \$40 million to date, the "Rising Spring" development will serve as an economic driver for the entire region and transform the physical and economic landscape near the campus.
