Working closely with Vice President, the Executive Director establishes fundraising priorities, stewards volunteer service boards, executes campaigns, and monitors targets to meet and/or exceed fundraising goals. Under the leadership of the Vice President for University Advancement, Dr. Meredith Brunen, University Advancement fosters connections with individuals, businesses, and organizations whose financial support enhances the programs, activities, and university community, enabling UWG to accomplish its mission with excellence. The 50-member comprehensive division includes Development, Alumni and Constituent Engagement, Communications and Marketing, Advancement Services, Data Integrity and Enrichment, and UWG Foundations.

While state funding provides financial support for the University, charitable giving funds many scholarships and improvements to UWG academic programs. The UWG Foundation was created in 1967 for the express purpose of raising, administering, investing, and transferring private gifts for the University of West Georgia. The foundation, a 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization, receives all gifts into the University and distributes them as per the donor's instructions.

THE POSITION

The Executive Director of Development is responsible for the strategic development, implementation, and management of philanthropic support, including major, annual, and planned giving, benefiting UWG. With the Vice President for University Advancement

(VPUA), the Executive Director builds and leads a high-performing fundraising team that meets and exceeds annual and campaign objectives.

This senior member of the University Advancement team works closely with the VPUA to establish fundraising priorities, steward volunteer service boards, execute campaigns, and monitor targets to meet and/ or exceed fundraising goals. The Executive Director participates in a wide range of university events, alumni events, and civic engagements within the scope of representing UWG.

Additional Responsibilities

- Provides leadership and strategic direction for the fundraising activities in each of UWG's academic and non-academic units, as well as Athletics, to ensure a cohesive, holistic approach in response to the University's strategic priorities.
- Works closely with University leadership, deans, major gift officers, and annual giving team to ensure an effective pipeline for moves management, including prospect assignment, cultivation, and solicitation to meet the strategic priorities of the University.
- Leads by example through the effective management including identification, cultivation, solicitation, and stewardship of a portfolio of principle and major gift prospects.

- Serves as a senior member of the University Advancement team, including providing leadership and working closely with the VPUA and Campaign Steering Committee to develop and successfully execute strategies to surpass campaign goals.
- · Assists VPUA with Board Relations for each of UWG's institutionally affiliated volunteer service boards, including the UWG Foundation Board of Trustees, UWG Athletic Foundation Board, Alumni Board, etc.
- Effectively builds relationships with the constituencies, assists with agent development and planning, as well as stewards these key advocates to maximize networks and leverage gifts of time, talent, and treasure.
- Handles other duties as assigned.

As Vice President for University Advancement, Dr. Meredith Brunen is responsible for overseeing the University Advancement division, which includes Development, Alumni and Constituent Engagement, Communications and Marketing, Advancement Services, and Data Integrity and Enrichment. She also serves as the Chief Executive Officer of the UWG Foundations, the University's nonprofit corporations: UWG Foundation, UWG Athletic Foundation, and UWG Real Estate Foundation.

Dr. Brunen previously served as Vice Chancellor for University Advancement and Chief Executive Officer of two foundations at the University of South Carolina Upstate in Spartanburg, South Carolina. She worked extensively and successfully to enhance fundraising outcomes for the university, help elevate the profile of USC Upstate, and engage community partners by sharing a strategic vision and the importance of the university to the region.

Prior to joining USC Upstate, Dr. Brunen served in executive leadership roles at the University of West Florida in Pensacola, Florida, and Northwest Arkansas Community College Foundation in Bentonville, Arkansas.

A practitioner and contributor to her field, Dr. Brunen is an active member of numerous national organizations, including the Association of Fundraising Professionals, the American Association of University Women, and the Council for Advancement and Support of Education. As a result of her achievements, she was recognized as a "Forty Under 40" by the Northwest Arkansas Business Journal, and honored as the "2014 Young Woman of the Year" at the Northwest Arkansas Business Women's Conference.

Dr. Brunen holds three degrees from the University of Arkansas: a bachelor's degree in international relations and Middle East studies, and both master's and doctoral degrees in higher education leadership.
