The main campus for Utah State University (USU) is located in Logan, Utah with 30 statewide locations and 60+ online degrees. USU is known as one of the nation's premier student-centered land-grant and space-grant universities. Founded as an agricultural college in 1888, USU enrolls 28,900 students who go by Aggies.

Utah State Aggies create transformational impacts through meaningful research, particularly in space, water, land, air, and quality of life questions. Aggies affect change locally, nationally, globally, and even galactically.

At Utah State, one finds award-winning faculty, state-of-the-art facilities, and career-driven degree programs. In fact, USU has six colleges plus the School of Graduate Studies, offering more than 130 majors and programs. USU offers 370 degrees and certificates

in its undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral programs. With a student to faculty ratio of 19 to 1, its most popular majors are Economics, Psychology, Mechanical Engineering, Computer Science, Kinesiology, Elementary Education, and Speech and Hearing

Known for its national rankings, USU has been ranked among the top 25 for its online bachelor program for nine straight years by U.S. News and World Report. It was also the recipient of the 2020 Award for Undergraduate Research Accomplishments by AURA; listed as the #5 most engaging college social media in nation by Rival IQ in 2023; the best employer in Utah by Forbes in 2023; and was named #18 best public university in the nation by Washington Monthly for 2023. USU has had 38 Goldwater Scholars as well.

Emma Eccles Jones College of Education and Human Services is committed to academic excellence in research, teaching, and service activities across a wide array of education and human service fields. The college is home to eight academic departments with approximately 200 faculty who are engaged in innovative research and high-level graduate and undergraduate education. The college is consistently ranked by US News and World Reports as one of the top Graduate Colleges of Education in the country, ranking 26th among public institutions of higher education in 2025 and 1st in the state of Utah for the past 25 years. The college's programs and outreach missions are strengthened by an on-campus elementary laboratory

school and five stand-alone centers, including the Sorenson Legacy Foundation Center for Clinical Excellence.

Faculty, students, and staff within the college also engage with a broad range of community partners to both provide opportunities for community-engaged research projects and learning, which enhances the overall quality of education and human service programs throughout the state of Utah.

The successful candidate will provide effective leadership including, but not limited to, responsibility for communication, ongoing program planning and assessment, and fiscal management. This opportunity includes working with college leadership in planning and directing increased funding aimed at facilitating growth in the nursing program, including hiring new faculty and increasing enrollment.

Minimum Qualifications

- Current RN license in Utah or eligibility for compact state licensure.
- Earned doctoral degree (PhD, DNP, or EdD) with at least one graduate degree in nursing OR master's degree in nursing (doctoral degree preferred).
- Minimum of six years of full-time nursing education experience, including three years in an academic leadership role.
- Demonstrated record of teaching, curriculum development, and service meriting faculty appointment at associate or professor rank.
- Substantial experience in academic leadership, program development, and faculty oversight within an accredited nursing program.
- Knowledge of ACEN/CCNE accreditation standards, best practices, and regulatory requirements.

- Strong leadership, communication, problem-solving, and organizational skills.
- Commitment to student-centered education and creating a diverse, equitable learning environment.

Preferred Qualifications

- Certification or advanced degree in nurse leadership, nursing education, or administration, OR national recognition as a leader by a professional nursing organization (e.g., NLN, AACN, AONL/UONL).
- Proven record of university or community service.

- Lead the Nursing Department's mission, strategic planning, and academic operations across all campuses.
- Oversee the delivery and continuity of the BSN, RN to BSN, and ADN programs, ensuring curricula are current, high-quality, and aligned with the university's objectives.
- Shape the future of the department by developing new programs and expanding existing ones to meet the evolving needs of nursing education.
- Integrate emerging technologies—such as simulation, telemedicine, and artificial intelligence—into teaching and clinical training to strengthen student readiness and relieve the burden on clinical sites.

- Oversee clinical operations for coordination of clinical placements and expansion of simulationbased learning opportunities.



Shawn Whiteman is the interim dean of the Emma Eccles Jones College of Education and Human Services. The move followed former Dean Al Smith's transition to interim president of Utah State University.

In his former role as associate dean for research and innovation, Whiteman cultivated growth in basic and applied research through innovative training programs; promoted connections with appropriate federal, state and industry partners; supported entrepreneurial initiatives; and facilitated technology transfer and unique forms of research translation.

"During this transitional period, the college will continue efforts to advance our missions focused on teaching and learning, research and scholarship, clinical training and practice as well as translation and extension," Interim Dean Whiteman said. "I am confident that work in these domains will maintain momentum given the talents of the faculty, staff and students in the college as well as the experienced leadership team across the CEHS."







Founded in 1859, Logan is nestled at the foot of the nearly 10,000-foot high Bear River Mountain Range. Situated on the Logan River in northern Utah about 80 miles north of Salt Lake City, Logan is known for its natural beauty. Logan Canyon, a 40-mile community park leading to 18-mile long Bear Lake, is called the Rocky Mountain Caribbean for its azure blue waters. Boasting outstanding fishing, biking, hiking, skiing, and golfing, Logan also has an excellent park system encompassing one of Utah's two zoos, and a challenging municipal golf course.

Logan features an opera company, repertory theatre, several dance companies, renowned artists, and fabulous facilities for them. Several points of interest include the LDS Tabernacle, Nora Eccles Harrison Museum of Art, American West Heritage Center, Museum of Anthropology, Logan Fine Art Gallery, Daughters of the Utah Pioneers Museum, and even a tour of Prodigy Brewing. Downtown Logan adds to the adventures as do sundry restaurants and shopping opportunities.

Logan has a wide range of economic sectors, with a focus on education, manufacturing and processing, medical services, agriculture, and retail businesses.

The city's largest employers are, of course, Utah State University and Space Dynamics Laboratory. Other major employers include ICON Health & Fitness (IFIT), Campbell Scientific, Cache Valley Bank, Conservice, Cache County School District, Cytiva, Entegris, Gossner Foods, Intermountain Health, JBS USA, Lee's Marketplace, Logan Regional Hospital, Logan City School District, Pepperidge Farm, RR Donnelley, Thermo Fisher Scientific, TTM Technologies, S&S - Sansei Technologies, and Schreiber Foods.

Logan is served by two public school districts mainly Logan City School District but also Cache County School District for certain neighborhoods. There are eight public schools in the Logan City School District: six elementary schools, one middle school, and one high school, Logan High School. The Cache County School District has four high schools outside Logan in other cities. Charter schools include Edith Bowen Laboratory School (K-6) on the USU campus, Bear River Charter School (K-6), and Fast Forward Charter High School. InTech Collegiate Academy is a STEM-focused, early college high school partnered with USU.
