WILLIAM CAREY UNIVERSITY, a private, Christian doctoral-granting, residential university, invites applications and nominations for a Board Eligible/Certified DO or MD to teach Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine in the College of Osteopathic Medicine. The faculty member will hold the academic rank of either Assistant or Associate Professor, commensurate with the experience and credentials of the candidate. The University seeks to fill the position in early 2021.

The Opportunity

Founded in 1892, William Carey University is a private university with campuses in Hattiesburg and Tradition, MS, and Baton Rouge, LA. The University has been under the leadership of Dr. Tommy King since 2007. The first alumnus to serve as President, Dr. King has significantly expanded the University's programs, facilities, and locations.

William Carey has experienced steady growth, reaching an all-time record enrollment of 5,260 students for Fall 2020. Undergraduate and graduate programs are offered across seven colleges and schools: the Ralph and Naomi Noonkester School of Arts and Letters, the School of Natural and Behavioral Sciences, the School of Business, the School of Education, the Donald and Frances Winters School of Music and Ministry Studies, the College of Health Sciences, and the College of Osteopathic Medicine.

William Carey University College of Osteopathic Medicine

The College of Osteopathic Medicine (WCUCOM) is growing. This year, it increased the size of its first-year class from 100 students to 160 as part of a three-year expansion plan authorized by the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation. The plan will ultimately result in the medical school's enrollment doubling from 400 students to 800 students.

The Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine (OMM) Department*

With the increase in class size, the Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine (OMM) Department needs to grow to maintain a critical faculty-to-student ratio for the hands-on lab training. The faculty desire to keep the small-group ratio no higher than 1:10 to provide quality education.

During this time of educating amid COVID-19, the faculty have been dedicated to creating innovative learning systems that combine online and in-person formats. All learning materials are made available via the online Learning Management System:

- Lectures are pre-recorded voice-over PowerPoints
- The Idaho COM OMT Video Library application is provided/required for the students to watch, study, and practice, so that they may come to the lab prepared with questions and to refine their OMT techniques <https://icomtvids.uscreen.io/catalog>
- Additional learning resources are found in playlists on the WCUCOM Clinical Medicine YouTube channel

Projects in progress:

- OMM Scholars program to begin Fall 2021
- Work with OMM Scholars on research projects
- OMM Scholars clinic on campus

* The Department of Osteopathic Principles and Practice will become the Department of Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine in January 2021.

- Working with the local hospitals/clinics so that clinical faculty will have the opportunity to practice medicine in either an out-patient or in-patient capacity

The Assistant/Associate Professor of Clinical Sciences (Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine)

Under the Course Director(s), Department Chair, and the Associate Dean of Clinical Sciences, the successful candidate will provide instruction specifically in Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine (OMM). The ability to teach in one or more of the biomedical/preclinical courses or clinical disciplines would be beneficial. The candidate will have administrative responsibilities commensurate with the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Works with Course Director(s), Department Chair, and Associate Deans to integrate and implement WCUCOM courses into a four-year, seamless curriculum using onsite, distance-learning, and other standard and emerging technologies.
- Reviews relevant WCUCOM curriculum in its entirety and recommends pertinent suggestions to the Course Director(s), Department Chair, and Associate Dean of Clinical Sciences.
- Teaches in assigned courses.
- Serves on WCUCOM committees, as assigned.
- Assists in the selection process of students to attend WCUCOM.
- Assists in student remediation as necessary and as recommended by the Promotion and Matriculation Committee.
- Assists in the interview process for prospective incoming faculty.
- Makes contributions to the advancement of knowledge and the development of osteopathic medicine through scientific research and community service.
- Participates in community relations efforts to extend and enhance the visibility and reputation of the Department, the College of Osteopathic Medicine, and William Carey University.
- Serves on state and regional societies, agencies, bureaus, and committees of the profession and specialty or discipline.
- Complies with WCU and professional standards and regulations including, but not limited to, ADA, HIPAA, OSHA, and safety training.
- Completes other duties as assigned by the Course Director(s), Department Chair, Associate Dean of Clinical Sciences, and the WCUCOM Dean.

- Board Eligible/Certified DO or MD with appropriate training and skills to carry out the duties of the position
- Specialty residency trained to practice (Primary Care or

- Clinical experience practicing OMT within area of specialty
- An active license, or eligibility for a license, to practice in the state of Mississippi (Will be required to have an active license in MS.)
- Graduate of an accredited College of Osteopathic Medicine or LCME with appropriate training and experience
- Curricular and teaching experience in formal and informal settings and learner supervision and evaluation
- Proven leadership, teaching, and clinical skills
- Excellent interpersonal and verbal and written communication skills
- Detail-oriented workstyle and demonstrated use of good judgment
- Expertise with Microsoft Office Suite products and the desire and ability to learn course management software/distance learning technologies
- Ability to complete multiple assignments and meet deadlines
- Ability to travel throughout Mississippi and the Gulf South region

- Experience in teaching and/or research in a COCA-accredited osteopathic medical school or college

Hattiesburg, Mississippi

Hattiesburg offers small town charm and friendly neighbors. Located just 90 miles from the state capital, the city is only 100 miles from New Orleans and 70 miles from the beautiful Mississippi Gulf Coast.

The city has more than 46,000 residents with the metro area population totaling nearly 150,000. Known as the "Hub City," Hattiesburg is the educational, cultural, retail, and medical center for the southeast Mississippi region. It offers both well-established and newly constructed neighborhoods and quality public and private schools.
