


Inviting Applications and Nominations for

The faculty member will hold the academic rank of either Assistant or Associate Professor, commensurate with the experience and credentials of the candidate. Applications are being reviewed when received.

The College of Osteopathic Medicine (WCUCOM) is growing. The fall of 2022 first-year class will increase from 175-200 as part of a three-year expansion plan authorized by the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation. The plan will ultimately result in the medical school's enrollment doubling from 400 students to 800 students.

Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine Department

With the increase in class size, the Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine (OMM) Department needs to grow to maintain a critical faculty-to-student ratio for the hands-on lab training. The faculty's desire is to keep the small-group ratio no higher than 1:10 to provide quality education.

Our curriculum is delivered in a flipped-classroom format. All learning materials are made available via the online Learning Management System:


- Lectures are pre-recorded voice-over PowerPoints
- Students are provided with a video library of osteopathic techniques to watch, study, and practice before lab so that they may come to lab prepared with questions and ready to refine their OMT skills
- Additional learning resources are found in playlists on the WCUCOM Clinical Medicine YouTube channel

Recently Implemented Programs:

- Establishment of an OMM Scholars program
- Several faculty research initiatives
- Establishment of an OMM clinic to serve the WCU faculty, staff, administration, and their families on campus

Future endeavors:

- Provide an outpatient clinic with community outreach with osteopathic education and treatment for all ages
- Set initial groundwork for future OMM residency program

Founded in 1892, William Carey University is a private, Christian university with campuses in Hattiesburg and Tradition, MS, and Baton Rouge, LA. The University has experienced steady growth, with more than 5,300 students enrolled for the 2021 fall term, a 2% increase over the 2020 enrollment.

The University ranks 2nd in the nation, by percentage of graduates, among programs for placing graduates into rural areas and 5th for placing graduates into underserved areas. It also ranks 3rd in the nation for producing the highest percentage of primary care residents over a three-year rolling average.



Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine Assistant / Associate Professor of Clinical Sciences

Under the Course Director(s), Department Chair, and the Associate Dean of Clinical Sciences, the successful candidate will provide instruction specifically in Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine. The ability to teach in one or more of the biomedical/preclinical courses or clinical disciplines would be beneficial. The candidate will have administrative responsibilities commensurate with the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Works with Course Director(s), Department Chair, and Associate Deans to integrate and implement WCUCOM courses into a four-year, seamless curriculum using onsite, distance-learning, and other standard and emerging technologies
- Reviews relevant WCUCOM curriculum in its entirety and recommends pertinent suggestions to the Course Director(s), Department Chair, and Associate Dean of Clinical Sciences
- Teaches in assigned courses
- Serves on WCUCOM committees, as assigned
- Assists in the selection process of students to attend WCUCOM
- Assists in student remediation as necessary and as recommended by the Promotion and Matriculation Committee
- Assists in the interview process for prospective incoming faculty
- Makes contributions to the advancement of knowledge and the development of osteopathic medicine through scientific research and community service

- Participates in community relations efforts to extend and enhance the visibility and reputation of the Department, the College of Osteopathic Medicine, and William Carey University
- Serves on state and regional societies, agencies, bureaus, and committees of the profession and specialty or discipline
- Complies with WCU and professional standards and regulations including, but not limited to, ADA, HIPAA, OSHA, and safety training
- Completes other duties as assigned by the Course Director(s), Department Chair, Associate Dean of Clinical Sciences, and the WCUCOM Dean

Required Qualifications

- Board Eligible/Certified DO or MD with appropriate training and skills to carry out the duties of the position
- Specialty residency trained to practice (Primary Care or ONMM, NMM-OMM, or C-SPOM preferred)
- Clinical experience practicing OMT within area of specialty
- An active license, or eligibility for a license, to practice in the state of Mississippi (Will be required to have an active license in MS.)
- Graduate of an accredited College of Osteopathic Medicine or LCME with appropriate training and experience
- Curricular and teaching experience in formal and informal settings and learner supervision and evaluation
- Proven leadership, teaching, and clinical skills
- Excellent interpersonal and verbal and written communication skills
- Detail-oriented workstyle and demonstrated use of good judgment
- Expertise with Microsoft Office Suite products and the desire and ability to learn course management software/distance learning technologies
- Ability to complete multiple assignments and meet deadlines
- Ability to travel throughout Mississippi and the Gulf South region

Preferred Qualifications

- Board Certified ONMM, NMM-OMM, or C-SPOM
- Experience as an instructor or course director of an OMM department or course
- Experience in teaching and/or research in a COCA-accredited osteopathic medical school or college
- Experience in more than one clinical discipline
- Experience in course development and curriculum integration
